The Culver Vol. Fire Co. #1 met in a called session - Chief Saine in chair. The object of the meeting was to raise funds to buy the building occupied ^{and owned} by Peter Keller as a barber shop.

After fully discussing the subject the following ^{provision} resolution was presented by Oland A. Gandy - and was adopted unanimously by the company with the understanding that Brother Gandy should re-write said ^{provision} resolution in the form of a by-law and present same to the company for final action. ^{at its next regular meeting.} Following is the resolution.

Fire Station

For the purpose of providing a fire station and meeting house for the company, the following provision be made.

Sec. 1. That fifteen shares of stock of the par value of three (\$3⁰⁰) dollars each be issued ^{and} purchased by the members of the Company - No member of which shall hold more than one share

Sec. 2. Any member who ceases to be a member of the Company shall surrender his share in said building to the Company, who shall hold the same in trust until disposed of as hereinafter provided.

Sec. 3. New members hereinafter admitted to the Company ~~who shall hold the same in trust~~ shall be required, within six months after their election to pay into the treasury of the Company the sum of three (\$3⁰⁰) dollars. When a share in the building fund shall be issued to him, such payment may be made in installments if desired with interest at 8 per-cent on

deferred payments,

Sec. 4. Stock issued to new members shall be in the order of surrender

Sec. 5. Any member of this company who does not hold a certificate shall not have a right to vote on any disposition of the building.

Sec. 6. All present members shall pay their share within ninety (90) days.

Sec. 7. All bylaws or parts of same in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

A committee of Chas. Asper, Monton Foss and Harry F. O. Saine was appointed to buy the building and have same moved. The following members paid cash in full \$300

It was voted that we draw from the Treas 1.66

It was also voted that we borrow
\$15.00 from Aris Menner and give a
note for same for (90) ninety days
with interest @ 8%. Mr. Menner
agreeing to take said note provided
that John H. Saine should go the
Company's security - this Mr. Saine
cheerfully agreed to do.

J. C. Ferris held a lien on said
building with (6.84) six and $\frac{84}{100}$ dollars
yet unpaid - He agreed to take the
Company note for said amount
due in ~~three~~ four months with

\$135 Paid in

interest at 8% this note ^{to be} was signed for the company by T. O. Saine and by the committee appointed to buy same - Said committee to take a receipt in full releasing said loan - which amount finished out the \$40⁰⁰ that we were to pay for building. Said committee are to take receipts for all money or moneys paid out.

Henry Litzengerberger agreed that and proposed that the Company should move the building on his lot just South of the Fox property for the privilege of which the Company is to pay the sum of (\$1.00) One dollar per year - payable annually

Building Funds

Sec 1

The Culver Volunteer Fire

Company No 1 having by an unanimous vote of all members present at a call meeting of the Company on March 16th 1905 decided to purchase a building for the use of the company and to pay for said building by an equal assessment upon all members of said funds so pronounced shall be known as the building funds

Sec 2 Said Building Funds shall consist of Fifteen (15) Shares of par value of Three Dollars ^(3.00) each.

Sec 3 Each member of the Company at the creation of said funds namely March 16th 1905 shall pay into the treasury of the Company within Ninety (90) days from date the sum of Three Dollars ^(3.00) and receive therefor a Certificate of Stock signed by the Chief and the Assistant Chief and attested by the

Secretary. Said may at option of the members be paid in instalment but any assessment not paid before Eight o'clock am, March 17th 1905 shall draw interest at the rate of eight per cent.

Sec 4 It shall be obligatory upon each member of the Company to purchase one certificate of stock representing one share in the building fund, but no member shall be entitled to possess more than one share excepting his prorata portion of such share as may be held by the Company as a unit as hereafter provided.

Sec 5 Any member of the company holding a share in the building fund who shall for any cause cease to be a member shall within five days after severing his connection with the Company surrender to the Secretary of the company his certificate

of stock taking the receipt of the Secretary
therefor. Said stock shall then be held
in trust for such person surrendering
the same until redeemed and cancelled
by the company.

Sec 6 Each new member ad-
mitted to this Company shall within
six months from the date of their
election pay into the treasury of
the company the sum Three Dol-
lars (\$3.00) and receive therefor a
Certificate for One share of Stock
in the building fund. Said
amount may be paid on or before
the first regular meeting of the
Company succeeding his election or
the event of such payment. said
amount shall be with interest. If
paid after the first regular meeting
of the company following his election
or if paid in instalments such amount

shall draw interest at the rate of eight
per cent

We the Committee presents the
following ^{to the} Bylaws of C. V. F. Co. No. 1
amendment

Any Member of Culver Volunteer
fire Co being guilty of any
misdemeanor shall have a
speedy trial and upon conviction
of same shall be fined
the sum of not less than \$5
nor more than four or at the
discretion of the company may
be expelled from said
company and by law or Part
of Bylaw Contrary to this
are hereby repealed
